## From Our Principal...

Dear Families,

Our students continue to experience a wide range of sporting and academic opportunities across Term 3. Our Year 11 and 12 Netballers, coached by Bronwyn Longbottom, were successful in securing a grand final berth in the local competition. The recent STEM Challenge has resulted in our Year 10s, supported by Mr Chris Heddles and Miss Amanda Manglesen, achieving first place at the regional competition, and progressing to the state finals in Adelaide. Our Mathematics faculty facilitated student participation in the annual Maths Quiz Night where our teams' gained awards across all age groups. Accolades included Junior and Senior Best General Knowledge, Intermediate Best Mathematics, and Intermediate and Senior Best Overall Team. We are excited to cheer on Paige Rasheed who has been selected for the State School Sports Team to compete at the National Cross-Country Championships in Adelaide this month, following her 11.52 minute run at the State Championships.

### **Career Expo**

Throughout Term 3 students will be supported through our home group program to explore subject selections for study as part of our Course Counselling process. As a part of this process, we invite families to attend our community event Pathways to a Pay-packet – Career Expo and Information Evening on Monday August 22nd 7pm – 9pm in the Williamson Hall.

### **New metrics for success**

In 2021 The University of Melbourne commenced its New Metrics Partnership joining with leaders (and by extension schools) who wanted to move beyond mere improvement and work together within a research partnership to address the meta-problems faced by Australian schools today and in the future.

In 2022 The University of Melbourne offered Naracoorte High School a place as a member of New Metrics for Success: Transforming what we value in schools.

Within this research-practice arrangement, our school is working with experts at the Assessment Research Centre and across the University to support the creation and validation of new metrics.

Naracoorte High school is one of 40 schools nationally and 5 across South Australia, who form the New Metrics Project.

A common ambition of partnership schools is to broaden the post-school pathways for students, by recognising a wider range of their capabilities and attainments than is currently represented in existing senior secondary certificates and records. The initiative is designed to broaden students' own understanding of their capabilities and future options.

Re-forming the design and organisation of learning to reflect new learning ambitions requires commonly agreed metrics for learner success, to be used by the community to measure thriving at school and to provide a better basis for assessing, recognising and improving learning. The University's psychometric team have now completed their analysis of the validation trial data, and the academic team have produced reports and draft empirical learning progressions for partner schools which we now use to inform our educational provisions moving forward.

### **Teaching Sprints**

Across term 2 we engaged in a process of reflective practice using Teaching Sprints to increase teacher expertise in the use of Before During and After Reading Strategies. Our teacher's increased their ability to design learning that focusses students on activities before they read assigned core texts, during the reading of the texts and then after they read them to support our students to improve their reading comprehension and competence in reading academic texts. Last week, teachers reviewed their developed strategies together in professional learning teams. Later this term we will measure the impact on student learning following data collection via PAT reading assessments.

### **Transition**

After the successful Naracoorte Nexus showcasing our subject offerings, our Transition to High School Program continues into Term 3. On Tuesday 25th August we will host Twilight Tours for families to experience the school facilities. Bookings for tours can be made directly by families online by accessing the following link:

If you haven't already, it's worth a trip to Robe to visit Transmutation.



## **STEM** Challenge



### The Science and Engineering Challenge is a nationwide STEM outreach program presented by the University of Newcastle in partnership with communities, Rotary clubs, universities and sponsors.

Through the Science and Engineering Challenge, students experience aspects of science and engineering which they would not usually see in their school environment.

On Friday 12th August the Naracoorte High School took an enthusiastic team of Year 10 students to compete in the annual Science and Engineering Challenge in Mount Gambier. With an early start and travelling through a frosty Winter landscape we embarked on Tenison Woods College ready to compete against 7 other teams from the South East.

30 students across both year levels worked in teams of 3-4 to design, construct, and test various problemsolving challenges to accrue points for a final place in the challenge. Activities included coding, designing a bionic hand, earthquake proofing a building, a bridge to transport gold ingots from a mine and items of modular furniture as well as selecting infrastructure to support energy efficient sources of electricity.

But best of all, we WON! Our team will head to Adelaide later this term to compete in the State Finals.







## A crucial session for all parents.

Your family and our school community need you to attend.

#### Over 600 teenagers are injured on our roads each year - You can do something about it! If your child has their Learners Licence (or is due to get it this year) then this will be an essential session for you as a parent or carer.

Parents are most likely to provide much of the driver education for their child, think about this;

- Do you know how to develop and build their driving experiences?
- Do you know how to reduce the risk of crashing or change the severity of the outcome?
- Are you really prepared for the task of supervising a novice driver?
- Have you kept up-to-date with road rule changes?
- Do you know what to look for in a Driving Instructor?
- Do you know what to look for regarding your child's first car?

Many South Australians believe that road fatalities and serious injuries are the result of risk taking or extreme behaviour. However, research shows that more than half of fatal crashes and 90% of injury crashes are due to mistakes, inattention or common lapses in judgement. Researchers believe that too many young drivers are not being taught well enough or equipped with enough skills and knowledge to drive safely.

This highly acclaimed program was originally developed with SA Police and is coming to our school. The program involves students AND parents and is presented by Darren Davis (Today Tonight, ABC Radio and 5aa Radio road safety expert).

It is essential that you attend our parents/supervising drivers evening session and help to make our whole school community more aware of how to make our new drivers better equipped for a safe driving future!

The parent's session will last for approximately one hour and is an informal discussion based session that could make a real difference to your family. We do NOT sell lessons or advertise any driving school. This session is to help parents with their choices.
