What is Omegle?

Omegle is a free online chat service that pairs random strangers for live text or video chats, encouraging their users to 'Talk to strangers!'. Individuals do not have to sign up, nor register any details to access the website.

We urge Parents to familiarise themselves with the website and the risks associated with the use of Omegle. More information can be found online via the National Online Safety website www.nationalonlinesafety.com.

The Omegle website is blocked within the school network. However it is important that families are aware that these filters do not apply on home networks when young people are accessing the internet at home using school devices. Parents and caregivers are encouraged to monitor home internet usage, including school issued devices, to ensure young people are making safe choices. Use of Omegle can pose a risk to young people's safety and wellbeing.

Lion's Youth of the Year

On the 20th February, three Year 12 students, Zach Pope, Jake Stewart and Russell Uyanguren, competed in the Naracoorte Lion's Youth of the Year competition.

This involved students preparing a five minute persuasive speech on a topic of their choice, that would also interest their audience. Students also prepared an application that reflected their achievements in a range of categories including leadership, sporting, academic and cultural activities. From this, students sat a 30-minute interview during which the three judges asked them numerous questions about our community, evaluating their general knowledge. On the evening, a Lion's dinner meeting was held during which Zach, Jake and Russell presented their prepared speeches and tackled two impromptu speech topics. Congratulations to all students, and a special shoutout to Zach Pope who presented a persuasive speech on the 'negative impacts of fracking', and well-rounded impromptus on 'an individual's role in raising global awareness' and 'who would you take to lunch?', winning both the Lion's Youth of the Year and the Public Speaking award, moving onto the Regional Final.

On the 5th March, Zach participated in the Regional Final, held at Kingston. Here Zach competed against two other students from Keith and Lucindale. Once again, Zach submitted an application, sat an interview, presented his five-minute prepared speech and delivered two impromptu speeches, this time on 'Should Australia continue celebrating Australia Day on the 26th January or move the date?' and 'Is Australia doing enough to combat climate change?' Once again, Zach won both the Lion's Youth of the Year and Public Speaking awards, moving him onto the State Final.

The State Final was hosted in Robe on the 19th March. Zach was up against tough competition from across the South East and Adelaide, following the same format as the previous two rounds. Zach took out first position as State Winner wowing the crowd and judges with his public speaking skills and general knowledge. The impromptu topics this round were 'Why do you believe vaping is so prevalent and what will be the future implications?' and 'How will greater exposure to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Island culture and histories help us move forward as a nation?'

Zach is now preparing for the National Finals to be hosted on the Gold Coast on 27th April. He will go up against other state winners from across Australia and will again present his prepared speech and two impromptus, while submitting an application and sitting an interview. We are incredibly proud of Zach, being the first student at Naracoorte High School to make it to Lion's Youth of the Year National Finals. Throughout the term a lot of behind-the-scenes preparation has taken place, from drafting and practicing his prepared speech, to adding to and refining his application and being across current events and headline news to prepare for possible impromptu topics.

Each year the Year 12 English students have the opportunity to participate in this worthwhile competition. It has allowed Zach to refine his already amazing public speaking skills, has connected him with like minded teens across our state and has taught him to think in his feet.

Good luck for the National Final, Zach!




Stage 1 & 2 Outdoor Education Update

Robot Scrimmage




On Sunday 26th March, the Student Robotics Club of South Australia, RoboRoo's, held a Robot Scrimmage at Naracoorte High School.



On Saturday April 1st, our Pedal Prix team returned to racing, after over a year off the track due to Covid.

This 8 hour race, Round 1, was held at McNamara Park Circuit in Mount Gambier. Our riders for this race were Cooper Faole, Grace Law, Lisa Tate, Taylor Whitehead, Nathan Rosmann, Travis Rosmann and Ashley Miles.

Nathan was first in the car, lining up on the grid with 84 other teams, to do the first lap of the 2.4km track.

A few minor adjustments were needed on the car, a broken horn meant that the riders had to manually connect the horn whilst on the track (no horn, no race), the chain came off a couple of times but was quickly put back on and we were told by officials that the tail light was not bright enough. A battery change and the car then had the brightest tail light on the track!

Our fastest lap of the day was completed by Nathan in lap 74 at 4.43 minutes. Cooper, who was attending his first Pedal Prix race, was in the seat for the chequered flag to finish the race in 74th position. Overall the team completed 80 laps, showing outstanding endurance, exceptional teamwork and continual enthusiasm in varying weather conditions.

Thank you to Rob Sandercock and Naracoorte Primary School for their continual support of our team. Also to the parents for transporting the riders to the race and for their support throughout the day. Well done everyone.

The team is now preparing for their next race on Saturday 20th May, at The Bend, Taillem Bend.



2023 marks 20 years of the Premier's Reading Challenge in South Australia!

To celebrate this momentous occasion, the Premier's Reading Challenge are offering students the opportunity to receive a special, 20th Anniversary certificate in addition to their usual PRC award this year.



To qualify for this certificate, students need to read 20 books in 2023, and fill out the "20 Years, 20 Books" student reading record instead of the usual 12 book record. The reading limits for each age group are as follows: – Years 7 to 9 – 4 books from the PRC book list, and 16 free choice titles – Years 10 to 12 – all 20 books are free choice

Students who complete the 20-book challenge will have also completed the 12 book challenge hence will receive the usual award as well.

The 20-book challenge is intended to be a voluntary, enjoyable, extension of reading for pleasure for those students who choose this option.

Personal Projects



Across Term 1, the Functional Literacy and Numeracy Class have designed and participated in 'Personal Projects'.

Students have had the opportunity to learn more about, practice and refine individual skills. Students selected skills from a wide range of topic areas, such as woodwork, science, art and sport. These students were able to share their skills with the rest of the class. A few students have reflected on these experiences:

Kade taught the class how to make slime. "I enjoyed mixing colours, adding glitter, and telling everyone what colour they will use. Everyone enjoyed making it. No one faced any challenges. If I were to make slime again, I wouldn't change anything. When I added the saline and glue together, it made slime. After that, water started to separate".

Will created a wooden puzzle, and reflected on this experience stating "my project was making a game in technology. It was a wood game. I got a heap of wood and drew lines and marked them out. I chopped it out and put it together".

Tyler designed a new sporting game for PE which was tested and enjoyed by the class. The PE game he created was called Sash Soccer. It combined soccer and sash-tag where students were put into teams and tried to score goals without their sashes being taken away. If they were, they had to sit out for 30 seconds. The students had so much fun and provided Tyler with some positive feedback.

A sausage sizzle was organized by a student named Max, where his aim was to raise money to go toward the wellbeing facilities at school. Max organized the supplies he would need for the sausage sizzle, designed a survey for students to vote on what resources they would like and will now work within this budget to purchase items required by his peers.

It has been a busy term for these students, with new opportunities arising moving into Term 2. The Functional Literacy and Numeracy classes will be working collaboratively to maintain the schools garden beds within the Community Garden. It will be interesting to see what they are able to produce over the coming months.

The Austdrive Youth Driver Awareness Program is designed for 16-28 year olds across SA, who currently hold a probationary, learner licence or full licence. Going beyond the scope of any learner training previously done, the Austdrive program training meets each young driver at their level and is designed to give young drivers a realistic view of their actual abilities (as opposed to what they think they can do). The course focuses on practical driver awareness, resulting in a true perspective, not the one their peers have given them. Prevention is better than cure when lives are at risk.

Course content includes:

- Basic car dynamics and control skills
- Emergency braking
- When two wheels are off the bitumen
- Safe steering
- Wildlife dangers
- Understanding speed, fatigue, alcohol, peer pressure
- Safe following distances
- Car modification (what's real and what's not)
- Observation techniques
- Emergency collision avoidance
