## **Naracoorte High partners** with University of Melbourne

Melbourne Assessment

Universities and leaders in Business across Australia have been in discussions about the skills students leave school with, and how what were traditionally known as "soft-skills", for example Communication, Collaboration and Quality Thinking, are actually essential to success. How can information about these skills be captured in a reliable way, and how does this form a part of University entry requirements, or used in a pathway to employment?

In 2022 and 2023 Naracoorte High has been a part of a Research Project with the University of Melbourne, a partnership which centres on the assessment and recognition of complex competencies, such as those listed above. Naracoorte High has been working in the area of Agency in Learning, determining how schools can work in partnership with families and community to give students the skills to independently know what to learn, how to learn it and who to learn it from.

As a part of this New Metrics for Success Pilot this year, we provided opportunities for our year 10 cohort



to self-assess their own agency in learning using tools and rubrics provided by the University. The process of the Pilot was shared with students within classes, and elements of learner agency analysed. This gave students explicit examples of what agency can look like across multiple contexts. Performance opportunities created by our teaching team have allowed students across Agriculture, The Arts, Food Tech, Outdoor Education, Pathways and Science to demonstrate their Agency.













## New Metrics continued...

In June, Naracoorte High representatives attended the Semester conference in Melbourne. Our Principal, along with leaders from other involved South Australian Schools Pultney Grammar, Wilderness School, Heathfield High and Glenunga International College, took part in a panel with SACE Board CE Michaela Bensley and Department for Education CE Martin Westwell, to discuss moves towards Learner Agency within our state, with South Australia described as first movers in this area of education.

Connections have been made with fellow partnership school, Wurun Senior Campus in Fitzroy, where an onsite visit has led to collaboration and transfer of ideas to develop the 10-12 Senior school at Naracoorte High in 2024.





To build on this work, our school has been selected to take part in the SACE Board Capabilities and Learner Profile Pilot in Semester 2. This Pilot explores how the Collective Engagement, Quality Thinking, Self-Motivated Learning, Principled Action, Personal Enterprise, and how this is reflected as a part of SACE Stage 2 results at the end of Year 12.

The SACE Board has declared that they are "committed to developing, recognising and certifying student's development of capabilities", and Naracoorte High is leading the way to ensure our students, staff and community are best placed at this time of change in education.

# We are a **New Metrics school**



#### What is New Metrics?

New Metrics is a research-practice partnership between innovative schools in Australia/NZ and The University of Melbourne. The partnership is at the forefront of global work looking to find solutions for improved ways to teach, assess and report on the complex competencies that learners need to thrive throughout and beyond their schooling life.

#### What are complex competencies?

Complex competencies are multiple knowledge, skills, attitudes, and values that combine to form an attribute. Examples of complex competencies include: agency in learning; acting ethically; active citizenship; communication; collaboration; and quality thinking. Such competencies are increasingly important in a modern world.

## New Metrics continued...

#### What does this mean for your child?

With practice, everyone can learn to get better at complex competencies along with other subject-based knowledge and skill. Our school values complex competencies as important because young people need them to navigate the modern world with sophistication. These competencies are also increasingly important for future employability, as well as training and study beyond secondary schooling.

As partners of The University of Melbourne, our school has access to next-generation assessment and reporting tools to measure the development of complex competencies, and resources to guide our teachers to design learning programs that support the development of competence in our students.

#### What is this work hoping to achieve?

The work of the New Metrics partnership aims to guide our practice and report on what learners can do beyond traditional domain-based knowledge and skills. Our teachers are developing learning programs that enable students to learn, exercise and demonstrate competence. Our school is committed to supporting our students to develop agency in learning, fostering students to know what to learn, how to learn it and who to learn it from. The more our learners develop agency, the more we hope they understand how to be motivated and act for a purpose that is meaningful to them or relevant to their community.

In Australia, there is an increasing number of schools, universities and employers interested in the deliberate teaching and assessment of complex competencies. The growing number of schools, including ours, that are participating in new assessment practices has opened the door for a national conversation on teaching and learning in Australia and we are looking forward to continuing to contribute to this important work.

Don't forget the extra certificate that can be gained this year.




We would also like to thank Miss Thomas and Miss Matthews for their help judging and supervising this competition.

# What's been happening on the Ag Block in Term 2...

The students have been busy preparing the steers and merino wethers for the 2023 Royal Adelaide Show in September. This year has seen over 40 students being involved in the program, which includes after school training to train the animals and working as a team to develop showmanship skills. Students are involved in the whole process, from working with the animals to feeding, general husbandry tasks and learning how to parade animals for the show. Currently, the school has 9 steers and 10 merino wethers being prepared.

We would like to say a big thank you to the breeders of the animals for their support of the program including Bottlesford Murray Greys, Days Whiteface, JB Angus, Limek Limousins, Phillips Cattle Company and Spence Show Steers.

The Year 10 students have also enjoyed working with the wethers to learn about fibre production and how to judge the animals on constitution, conformation, and wool quality.



Over the holidays, the Ag Block is looking forward to seeing some redevelopments occurring including a new pad for the sheep yards to be moved onto and a new entry fence to the farm.

# Naracoorte High well represented at the recent Rostrum Semi Finals!
