Koala Crossing Information

A friendly reminder that our school has a Koala crossing indicated with white road markings, red and white posts and two yellow alternating flashing lights.

They are only operational when the yellow lights are flashing between 8.15am – 8.45am and 3.15pm – 3.45pm, a speed limit of 25 km/h applies to drivers between signs on the approach to the crossing.

Drivers must stop for pedestrians using or about to use the crossing.

Students on bicycles must dismount from their bike and walk across.

2024 has started with a bang in the English faculty!


