A significant component of the competition was a 30-minute interview, during which three judges assessed their general knowledge through a series of thought-provoking questions.

On the evening, during a Lions dinner meeting, the students presented their prepared speeches and faced two impromptus peech topics: "If you could have any superpower, what would it be and why?" and "We live in an ever-changing world—what do you hope for your future?". Congratulations to all participants for their outstanding efforts. 
