We wish Elise all the best and can't wait to hear all about it on her return.













Recently Imogen was advised that she had won the Pharmaceutical Society of South Australia Gold Medal for 2024. She graduated in April and is currently on an internship year at Terry White here in Naracoorte.

The SA Gold Medal is awarded on completion of the Bachelor of Pharmacy at the University of SA to the student who has the highest grade point average and has completed the program within four academic years, providing the final GPA is above 6.25.

Given the stringent criteria the PSA Gold Medal is not awarded every year. It is the most prestigious student award and has been awarded since 1896.

Imogen was awarded her gold medal at The Playford in Adelaide last Friday night and the medal is actually pure gold!

Imogen's family and the wider community are very proud of her achievement and thrilled to see all her hard work and dedication to her studies rewarded.

Rostrum Voice of Youth



Anti Racism Education



Naracoorte Stands Against Racism!

This term, students at Naracoorte High School are participating in an Anti-Racism education program during weekly Home Group sessions. The program encourages students to reflect on real-life scenarios and stories, promoting respectful discussion and action around racism, culture, and identity.

Prompted by survey results showing that 73% of students believe racism is an issue at NHS, the initiative focuses on the school's motto: "I Speak Up. I Listen. I Learn."

Some of the topics that are being explored include:

- Understanding what racism is and how to actively oppose it.
- Respecting cultural differences in names, traditions, and appearances

- Learning about key figures such as Faith Bandler and Eddie Mabo, whose legacies continue to shape Australia's progress toward equality
- Responding appropriately to the use of racial slurs and discriminatory language

This ongoing work is helping to build a safer, more inclusive environment where every student is heard, supported, and empowered to make a difference.



SA History Month - Naracoorte & Surrounds

During May, in the library, SA History Month is celebrated with a display of local history books and copies of photographs from our archives. Presently the display is of Naracoorte and the surrounds, this will be followed up with a display on the history of Naracoorte High School which will include old school magazines.

Term 1 Overview

During term one, 1963 items were loaned out from the Library, including 1369 books, 365 laptops, 153 sports uniforms plus musical instruments, calculators & magazines.

Of the books borrowed 564 were textbooks, 388 were fiction novels, 242 were quick reads and 139 were non-fiction. The other books borrowed also included teacher reference and special collections.

Our Quick Read section which includes Graphic Novels again proving very popular. Our Graphic Novel section presently consists of 282 books from which 162 loans were made.

The most popular books from that section were 'Sonic the Hedgehog', 'One Piece: east blue' and 'Please be my star'. The most popular general fiction for term one included 'It's not summer without you', A good girl's guide to murder' and '200 minutes of danger'.



Also, 108 items were added to the overall collection during term one and 174 items were removed, either due to age, condition or relevance.
