You cannot make a good decision about subject selection if you don't know what is involved in each subject. It's really important that you refer the Senior School Course Handbook and read the detailed information, especially the assessment part, about any subjects that you are considering. The Course Handbook can be located on the school website under the curriculum tab, Senior School. There is also a link to Flexible Pathways that includes an overview of School Based Apprenticeships (SBNA) and Vocational Educational Training (VET), but this is also covered in more detail in Handbook.

If you are considering a subject next year that you are currently doing but are not meeting a C grade or better, now is the time to address this. Your teachers will be making recommendations into subjects based on your application to the course this year.
